


Introduction

In response to the unprecedented challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the National Service Scheme (NSS) volunteers of KCT's Late G. N. Sapkal College of Engineering extended their support to the community through various initiatives. This report focuses on the distribution of food and water to the needy and traveling workers, as well as the distribution of sanitizers to individuals who lacked access to these essential items during the pandemic. To support to this noble cause and to motivate out volunteer Hon. CMD of Kalyani Charitable Trust Dr. Ravindra sapkal also distributed Arsenic album -30, homeopathic tablets to the needy people.

Objective

The primary objective of these initiatives was to address the immediate needs of vulnerable populations affected by the pandemic. The NSS volunteers aimed to provide relief to those who were facing difficulties in accessing food, water, and sanitizers due to economic hardships or limited availability.

Food and Water Distribution:

sanitization.


- o Distribution points were established in underserved communities where individuals might not have access to sanitizers or the means to purchase them.
